All information supplied to the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences MI Scholarship Committee must be accurate and is subject to verification.

By submitting an application for a MI-NATAS Scholarship or HS Grant, you are certifying that:

For College Scholarship:

- your grades and test scores are being reported accurately
- your essays and other written responses are your work alone, without inappropriate assistance from others or the inclusion of text authored by others
- your representation of your involvement in creative works, school activities, and field or work experience is completely truthful
- you intend to apply any scholarship awarded towards a college-level education in a major aligned to pursuing a career in the television industry or related field

For the High school Grant:

- you are the teacher of a scheduled TV production/editing, etc. class
- the grant will be used to purchase production equipment for your studio/class
- works submitted are from the current school year's class and is all their own work
- no commercially produced or stock footage is included
- this is not a club

Members of the Scholarship Committee of the Michigan Chapter of The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences will determine the scholarship recipients and their decision is final.

Applications found to have violated the letter or spirit of this Honor Code are subject to disqualification from this and future scholarship consideration and/or revocation of any scholarship awarded, at the sole discretion of the MI-NATAS Scholarship Committee.

General Rules: Only Michigan residents/high schools are eligible for the scholarship/grant. Work submitted must be done by the student/class and representative of the student's ability. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit. Scholarship applicants must be enrolled/accepted in a program of an accredited 4 year college or university. High School grant applicants must be a Michigan high school. Decision of the Scholarship Committee of eligibility and awardee is final.
