By submitting an application for a MI-NATAS Scholarship or High School Grant, you are certifying that:

For College Scholarship:

- your grades and test scores are being reported accurately
- your essays and other written responses are your work alone, without inappropriate assistance from others or the inclusion of text authored by others
- your representation of your involvement in creative works, school activities, and/or field work experience is completely truthful
- you will apply any scholarship awarded towards a college-level education in a designated major and/or curriculum pursuant towards a career in the television industry or related field

For the High School Grant:

- you are the instructor/teacher of a scheduled TV production and/or post-production (editing) class, etc.
- the grant will be used to purchase production equipment for your school's studio/class
- submitted projects/works are from the current school year's class, and is all their own work
- no commercially produced nor stock footage is included
- the submitting class is a certified, credited instruction class; and not a club

Members of the Scholarship Committee of the Michigan Chapter of The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences will determine the scholarship recipients and their decision is final.

Applications found to have violated the letter or spirit of this HONOR CODE are subject to disqualification from this and future scholarship consideration and/or revocation of any scholarship awarded, at the sole discretion of the MI-NATAS Scholarship Committee.

General Rules: Only Michigan residents and high schools are eligible for the scholarship and/or grant. Work submitted must be done by the student and/or class; and representative of the students' abilities. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit. Scholarship applicants must be enrolled/accepted in an accredited associate or baccalaureate college or university program. High School grant applicants must be currently enrolled in a recognized/designated Michigan high school. Decisions of the MI-NATAS Scholarship/Education Committee regarding eligibility and awardee(s) is final.
